

§ Thomas Eliza Mahony by her deed of Mortgage Dated June 29<sup>th</sup>

X D 1859 filed for Record in the Recorder's Office within and for the County of Jackson and State of Missouri on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 1859 and Recorded in said Recorder's Office in Book 31 page 579 conveyed to one John Johnson the following described Real Estate Situate in the City of Kansas County of Jackson and State of Missouri to wit Being a part of a tract of land described in the Recorder's Plat of the town of Kansas - Island etc (see) said land having been by said Johnson subdivided and lots and is recorded. The portion hereby Released is described in the Plat recorded by said Johnson as Lot 100 Situate in Block Number Forty four be the same more or less as described in the above named Mortgage, To secure to the undersigned John Johnson the payment of three promissory Notes dated the 29<sup>th</sup> day of June A D 1857 the first for fifty Dollars due on the 29<sup>th</sup> day October A D 1857, the second for one hundred and fifty Dollars due one year after date and the third for one hundred and forty Dollars due Eighteen Months after date each executed and delivered by said Eliza Mahony to said John Johnson, and Thomas Know all unto by these presents that for and in consideration of the amount of the aforesaid aforesaid notes and all the interest due thereon having been to me in hand paid this day by the said Eliza Mahony the Recorder whereof is hereby acknowledged, I the said John Johnson do hereby Release and forever quit claim unto the said Eliza Mahony the above described Real Estate. all of said Slaves are warrant to be saved so far as we know  
both in body and mind free from any membranes and Slaves  
during their natural lives. Three of the above named Slaves  
being this day delivered to the said Mr B Bland  
the other Slaves now in Kansas being the same of Mr  
Walden to be delivered on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of the present month  
if living to the said Board at Kansas City. Said Slave Thomas  
life at Risk of the said Board from and after this date  
comes under our hands this day & date above written

in the County of Jackson and State of Missouri have this  
day for and in consideration of the sum of Ten Hundred &  
Twenty five Dollars to the said Miles B Bland in hand  
paid by Michael Crutcher the Receipt whereof is hereby  
acknowledged granted bargained and sold and by these  
presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Michael  
Crutcher of the City of Kansas in the County of Jackson  
and State of Missouri one Negro Man named Thomas a Slave  
aged about thirty three years being the same Slave purchased  
by me from Mr T Sumner and Mr Anna Bordin whole I warrant  
to be free from all claims or any membranes whatsoever and  
a Slave during his natural life and which said Negro  
Man Thomas I have this day delivered to said Michael  
Crutcher. In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my  
name and affixed my seal this 20<sup>th</sup> day of April  
1861
