Know all men by these presents that I John Stanton of the County of Jackson and State of Missouri, for the consideration of the sum of one dollar to me in hand paid and the further consideration herein after mentioned, do give, grant bargain and sell unto David Roberts of the County and State aforesaid the following property to wit Four Negroes named Munda, City, Saml & Daniel belonging to and in possession of said Stanton.

I do have and do hold the said property above mentioned and described to him and his heirs forever.

And upon Trust nevertheless, that said Stanton is indebted to Geo O'Quinn in the sum of Eight hundred dollars bearing interest at the rate of Ten per cent per annum from the first day of January next.

Now if the said Stanton will pay the said O'Quinn by the first day of January next the above mentioned sum of Eight hundred dollars then this obligation to be void else to remain in full force and effect.

And if the said sum of Eight hundred dollars above mentioned is not paid at the above time stipulated, then said Roberts shall proceed to sell said property for the best price that he can get at public auction, giving twenty days previous notice of the time and place of said sale, and that of the proceeds thereof to pay the charges and costs in and about the sale of said Trust, then pay the said O'Quinn the above mentioned sum and interest, and the residue if any to be paid to the said Stanton.
