FIELD TRIP INFORMATION SHEET

TOPICS:

Tours typically take around 50 minutes to an hour.

- The Civil War
 - Medicine
 - Battle of Westport
- Wornall Family History
 - Family Life in the Victorian Era
- Enslavement on the Missouri/Kansas Border

Tour price: \$5/student

FAQS:

How long do you suggest for field trips?

We typically suggest 90 minutes (60 minutes for the tour and 30 minutes for the activity/activities). If you have particular time constraints or want to be on site for a certain length of time, let us know and we will work to accommodate you!

Is there space to eat lunch on site?

Yes, we have a large lawn space as well as 6 outdoor picnic tables. We do not have indoor space for lunch.

ACTIVITIES:

We suggest budgeting around 15-30 minutes per activity,

- Object Handling
 - Students get the opportunity to learn about and handle several Civil War artifacts.
- Medical Instrument Identification
 - Students identify medical instruments that were used during the Civil War and learn about how they were used.
- Civil War Soldier Food Journaling
 - Students learn about the diet of Civil War soldiers
 - Students compare their own diets through a food journal.
- Civil War Uniform Analysis
 - Students learn how to identify and interpret different aspects of Civil War uniforms (buttons, belts, etc.)
 - Students use their new information to figure out who would have worn the uniform in the museum. Students also design their own uniform based on the identifiers.
